## Funding secured for landmark co-operative research























Thanks to the outstanding generosity of these leading Kiwi co-ops, we have now secured the funding to carry out what will be a landmark university-led research study into the co-operative sector here in NZ and its importance to the local economy.

Championed by Cooperative Business NZ, the University of Auckland and Massey University are joining forces to conduct the "Co-operative Economy of New Zealand" research project between August and November.

Co-operatively funded between Fonterra (lead sponsor), Ballance Agri-Nutrients, CDC Pharmaceuticals, Co-op Money NZ, Farmlands, FMG, Foodstuffs South Island, Market Gardeners, Mitre 10, Ravensdown and Silver Fern Farms, the project represents increasing co-operation between CBNZ and NZ universities, using data from recent surveys and cases studies that have been completed by researchers at the two universities.

With 115 co-operatives registered under the Cooperative Companies Act 1996, the combined annual revenues of these organisations amounts to over \$NZ43 billion – that's almost 15% of NZ's GDP.

On the back of United Nations (UN) and International Co-operative Alliance (ICA) reports indicating New Zealand to be one of the most co-operative economies in the world, the commissioned research will systematically describe the current economic contribution of NZ's top 30 co-ops and outline key strengths, achievements, and challenges of the cooperative model in NZ.

Several benefits for NZ co-operatives are expected from the research, including accurate facts and figures about the current contribution of NZ's cooperative economy that can be used to educate key stakeholders about the nature, extent and importance of cooperatives in NZ. In addition to education, an accurate picture can help advocate for the profile and needs of organisations in NZ's cooperative economy.

The final report is due in early December 2016. We will keep you informed of progress as the next stage gets underway.
